



WARWICK - Queensland, Australia. They even have a St Mary's parish church!



WARWICK - Bermuda. Warwick Parish is one of the nine parishes of Bermuda. It is named after Robert Rich, 2nd Earl of Warwick (1587-1658). The parish also contains Warwick Camp, the former rifle ranges of the Imperial military garrison, which is, today, the home of the Bermuda Regiment



WARWICK - Ontario, Canada. Warwick is a rural community located in the southwestern part of Ontario, Canada. It is a small town that oozes charm with its scenic sights and friendly locals.



WARWICK - Quebec, Canada. Warwick is a small town north east of Montreal, located in Arthabaska county, Quebec, Canada. The town was incorporated in 1861 and claims to be one of the possible birthplaces of Canadian national dish, poutine (fries with gravy and cheese curds).



WARWICK - Maryland, USA just west of the Delaware border. It holds the distinction of hosting George Washington twice during his travels.



WARWICK - Pennsylvania, USA. Richard Carter was the first settler in the area. He settled near the mouth of the Conestoga River in 1716. Carter was born in Warwickshire, England, and is given credit for naming the municipality Warwick.



WARWICK - Orange County, New York. In the early 1700's, one of the original patent holders, Benjamin Aske, named his land "Warwick", presumably after an area of England near his original ancestral home. He began to sell it off to settlers in 1719.



WARWICK - Benson County, North Dakota, USA. Warwick was founded in 1907. The population was only 55 at the 2020 census!



WARWICK - Franklin County, Massachusetts, USA. With a history dating back to 1739. It is known for its natural features, such as Mount Grace, Richards Reservoir, and the Metacomet-Monadnock Trail.



WARWICK - Oklahoma, USA. Warwick lies on the famous Route 66, eight miles west of Chandler, the county seat. Warwick, named after our own county town, was established by Monarch Investment Company on September 18, 1903, on land homesteaded by David M. and Norah High. A postal service for the area was started October 26, 1892, by J. A. Ramsey, who became Warwick's first postmaster.



WARWICK - Jamaica. Warwick Castle is a hamlet in St. Mary, Jamaica



WARWICK - Georgia, USA. Home to a South Georgia tradition, the National Grits Festival, held in April each year. Grits are a type of porridge made from coarsely ground dried corn, then flavoured with a sweet or savoury topping.



WARWICK - Virginia, USA. Warwick County was a county in Southeast Virginia that was created from Warwick River Shire, one of eight created in the Virginia Colony in 1634. The first courthouse and jail were located at Warwick Towne, established in 1680. It is now part of the independent city of Newport News, Virginia



WARWICK - UK. Our own Warwickshire county town. The original and the best!



WARWICK BRIDGE – CUMBRIA. Warwick bridge is a pleasant village beside the River Eden, and on the main A69 Carlisle to Newcastle trunk road. This small village contains two rather grand houses. One, Warwick Hall (pictured), was the home of the Liddle family who owned much of the land in the vicinity, including the whole of the nearby village of Warwick-on-Eden.
